# Caradon Hill Area Heritage Project presents 'Village People'



An exhibition covering life in settlements across Bodmin Moor is to run in Liskeard. The Caradon Hill Area Heritage Project is co-ordinating 'Village People', an exhibition looking at the lives and industries of days gone by in and around Darite, Linkinhorn, Moorswater, North Hill, Pensilva and St Neot.

The Caradon Hill Area Heritage Project (CHAHP) is a Heritage Lottery Fund Living Landscape Partnership Project helping to recognise, conserve and enhance the area's special character. Through events, groups, information sharing and innovative projects, CHAHP involves local residents in all aspects of the heritage and landscape, aiming to celebrate local distinctiveness, protect wildlife and livestock grazing, conserve mining and prehistoric sites, and encourage local skills training.

The exhibition will be hosted at three venues around the town, Stuart House, Liskerrett Community Centre and Liskeard and District Museum. The display at Liskerrett Community Centre will concentrate on examples of works produced by participants in the courses that have been run at the centre in partnership with CHAHP. Courses have included Cornish Music Making led by Steve Hunt, a well-known musician on the Cornish/national folk scene, painting classes run by local artist Jennie Boniface, textile sessions with Sue Field, and short story writing workshops run by Lianne Crocker.

Following on from the success of the courses, the Liskerrett Community Centre is in the process of putting together a brochure of forthcoming courses for the Autumn term which should be available soon. Courses already planned include sculpture, painting techniques, digital storytelling, willow structures and working with different textiles.

The Village People exhibitions run at Stuart House, the Liskerrett Community Centre, and Liskeard Museum from Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> June to Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> July. Following its stay in the town the exhibition will tour the villages of North Hill, St Cleer, Pensilva and Rilla Mill and will also be at the Liskeard Show on the 14<sup>th</sup> July.

## Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> June - Moorswater Memories

In conjunction with a walk led by Iain Rowe around the Moorswater area, local historian Sue Field will be in Stuart House from 9.30am-2pm collecting any memories and photographs that local people may have of the Moorswater area before the construction of Liskeard By-Pass in the seventies.

'If you have photographs or recollections about the Moorswater area that you would like to share, please come along to Stuart House' said Sue who will have a scanner to scan any photographs that are brought along. Any recollections that are recorded will be put together into a 'Memory Viaduct' that will become part of the Village People exhibition.

The walk around Moorswater leaves Stuart House at 10am on the Saturday morning of 30<sup>th</sup> June, returning at about 1pm. For those who would like to join in the walk but do not feel up to walking from Stuart House, feel free to join the walk at Moorswater Lodge, at the bottom of Old Road at about 10.30am.

Liskerrett Community Cinema are pleased to announce that they will be screening the newly released feel-good romantic comedy **Tortoise in Love on Friday 20th July (Certificate 12A)**

A genuinely funny romantic comedy made by (almost) the entire village of Kingston Bagpuize and Southmoor had a red carpet premier in Leicester Square on 24th May and will be available in cinemas from 13th July.

However the films distributors are making the film available simultaneously in both big cinemas and in local village halls through Community Cinema groups.

The entire film is set in the beautiful English countryside of the Vale of the White Horse in Oxfordshire.
